 - Biogas production and addition of gypsum to slurry
 - One from Germany
 - Drying of digestate from biogas plants
 - One from Sweden
 - Processing of manure
 - Two from Denmark
 - Acidification of slurry and mechanical separation

The winner is:

- Biotain AB from Ängelholm, Sweden
 - CEO Per Ewers
 - Splitbox – Agri
 - Processing of manure to a dry and a liquid fraction and purified water
